The following guidelines will be used to award the Nick and Loraine Delesandri Memorial Scholarship to a CCISD graduating senior.

ELIGIBILITY:

The following requirements must be met for a student to be eligible for the Nick and Loraine Delesandri Memorial Scholarship:

- 1. Be a graduating senior from a CCISD high school who is entering a college, university, junior college, or vocational/technical school for the upcoming fall semester.
- 2. Applicant must have an overall 2.5 GPA.
- 3. Applicant must be able to demonstrate long-term commitment to the program while being a member of a CCISD FFA Chapter.
- 4. Applicant must enter a project in the annual CCISD Livestock Show his/her senior year.
- 5. Applications must be submitted completed. Be sure all sections are completed and the grading rubric which is to be completed by your Ag teacher is included with the application.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE:

- 1. The scholarship committee shall be decided by members of the Delesandri family.
- 2. The 2018 recipient will receive a \$500.00 scholarship. Payment will be distributed once proof of enrollment has been submitted to Delesandri family.

Applicant must return completed application to the Agriscience instructor at his/her high school no later than January 16, 2018. The Agriscience instructors will return all completed application to the Ag office on January 17, 2018. No application will be accepted after January 17, 2018. Delesandri family will pick up applications on January 17, 2018.

The 2018 recipient will be announced at the CCISD Livestock Show. Winner will have until the end of the first semester to claim his/her scholarship. The scholarship is non-transferable.
